The flat areas of Norfolk and Suffolk had numerous Windmills for drainage and milling grain. Being coastal there are also many lighthouses. Broadland Holiday Village is the perfect base to discover both.

Horseley Drainage Mill

Restored drainage mill. Striking views across the Mere.

Berney Arms Windmill

Halvergate Marshes. Reached by footpath from Halvergate and Great Yarmouth or by hire boat. Tallest wind pump in the country.

Stacey Arms

Alongside the A47 between Great Yarmouth and Acle.

Thurne Dyke

Open regularly through the summer. Telephone for details. Walk in the footsteps of warriors, Pagans and Kings. One of the Country's most important archaeological sites. Exhibition hall tells the story of early English history.

Thorpeness Water Tower

The 'house in the clouds' was built to resemble a house in order to disguise the Water Tower which functioned until 1923.
